GYM STORAGE SPACE:

"Conditions for storage" forms must also be signed if this has not been done in the process of moving into the storage space at an earlier time. Items not identified/claimed by September 5, 1980, will be considered abandoned and disposed of according to established procedure. Persons no longer residents of Seminary housing are reminded that there is a 30 day limit on storage after moving from the campus.

since 1975, has asked President Lolley to relieve him of his responsibilities as Dean at the end of his current six-year term, on July 31, 1981. He is applying to the Trustees for a study leave during the academic year 1981-82, in order to assume full time teaching duties in pastoral care in the fall of 1982. (2) Dr. John W. Tresch, who has served as associate professor of evangelism for the past two years on a presidential appointment, has asked that his name not be considered for permanent appointment. He will continue teaching through this academic year. (3) Beginning August 1, Mr. G. Paul Fletcher assumed the position of Business Manager. (4) Mr. O. L. Cross is now serving as the Director of Housing. The housing office is located on the second floor of Mackie Hall. (5) The title and function of Mr. Clarence Pearce in the Plant Services department has been changed to, "Assistant Director of Plant Services and Director of Maintenance."
