for a Seminary External Education Division (SEED). This new division will greatly expand the seminaries' capability of delivering quality theo-

logical education off-campus to every person in the country who qualifies for it. The division will include home study, extension center, and satellite components utilizing both traditional and non-traditional methodologies.
