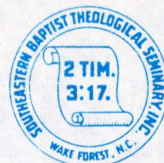
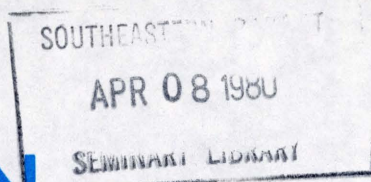

GUESTS OF INTEREST: Robert W. Bailey and Mary Frances Bailey, co-authors of Coping With Stress in the Minister's Home, will be on our campus Thursday, April 8. They will speak in chapel and will also be available for a dialog session in the Mackie Hall Commons Room from 1:30-2:30. Dr. Bailey is senior minister at First Baptist Church, Concord, N. C. He has written two additional books, The Minister and Grief, and God's Questions and Answers. He and Mrs. Bailey have served churches in Virginia, Kentucky and North Carolina.

LEA LAB AND NORTH COLLEGE ST. PARKING: The renovation process in Lea Laboratory is scheduled to begin on Monday, March 31, 1980, and will, at times, eliminate student parking on the south side of the lot. Available parking will be designated as construction needs dictate during the next 12-15 months. Staff parking will not be affected immediately on the north side of the lot, but may be changed as construction needs arise. The Town of Wake Forest has approved parking for both sides of North College Street, and trees have been trimmed to prevent damage to automobiles. Parking is prohibited 50 feet from the intersection at North Avenue and 15 feet on either side of residential driveways. This action will help to eliminate some of the parking problems on this side of our campus, and provides more spaces than will be lost in the Lea Lab lot.

VAN MINISTRY: On Wednesday, April 9 interviews will be held for students interested in participating in a van ministry to the Delaware Valley Association of the Pennsylvania-South Jersey Convention. Students will serve as associate ministers of established congregations and will be supervised by pastors, convention personnel, and seminary personnel. Students who wish to know more and/or to apply for these positions should schedule interviews through the Formation in Ministry Office.
