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The State of Alabama Benton County  
We the members of the Baptist Church or Churches  
at the Gap of mountain being anxious to be  
constituted into a church. Petitioned a Presbytery  
to attend us on Saturday before the first Sunday  
in June 1841

#### Abstract of Principles

- Article 1<sup>st</sup> We believe in one only true and living  
god and that there are three persons in the godhead  
the Father the Son and holy Ghost
- 2<sup>nd</sup> We believe that the scriptures of the old and  
new Testaments are the word of god and only  
rule of faith and practice
- 3<sup>rd</sup> We believe that god Elected or chose his people  
in christ before the foundation of the world  
that they should be holy and without blame  
before him in love.
- 4<sup>th</sup> We believe in the doctrine of original sin and  
man's impotency to recover himself from the fallen state  
he is in by nature by his own free will and ability

- 5<sup>th</sup> we believe that we are justified in the sight of god only by the imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ
- 6<sup>th</sup> We believe that gods Elect shall be called effectually regenerated and sanctified by the holy ghost and shall persevere in grace and never finally fall away
- 7<sup>th</sup> we believe that Baptism and the Lords supper are ordinances of Jesus Christ and that true believers are the only proper subjects of these ordinances and the true mode of Baptism is Immersion
- 8<sup>th</sup> We believe in the resurrection of the dead and a general judgement and that the punishment of the wicked will be everlasting and that the joys of the righteous will be eternal.
- 9<sup>th</sup> We believe that no Minister has a right to administer the ordinances only such as are called of god as was aaron and come under the imposition of hands by a Presbytery and in fellowship with the church of which he is a member
- 10<sup>th</sup> We believe that God has ordained good works that his children should walk in them and that good works are only such as God hath commanded in his word and ~~not~~ such as without the warrant thereof are devised by men out of blind zeal or upon any pretence of good intention
- 11<sup>th</sup> We therefore believe that washing the saints feet was ordained by Christ to be done by his children in a church capacity until his second coming

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## Church Covenanted.

Forasmuch as almighty god by his grace  
has been pleased to call us whose names  
are underneath subscribed out of darkness  
into his marvellous light having regularly  
Baptised upon a profession of our faith  
in Christ Jesus and having given up our-  
selves to the Lord and to one another in  
a gospel church way to be governed and  
guided by a proper disciplin agreeable to  
the word of god we do therefore in the name  
of our Lord Jesus and by his assistance cove-  
nant and agree to keep up the disciplin  
of the church we are members of in the  
most brotherly affection toward each  
other while we endeavor punctually to  
observe the following rules (viz)

Rule the 1<sup>st</sup> We will endeavor to keep the  
unity of the spirit in the bonds of  
peace to watch over each other for good  
and if need be in the most tender and  
affectionate maner to reprove one another  
that is if we discover any thing amiss in  
a brother to take the directions of our  
blessed Jesus recorded in the 18<sup>th</sup> chapter  
of his gospel by st Matthew and not the  
whispering backbiting and hating one  
another Rule 2<sup>nd</sup> We will not fail unless  
providentially hindred filling our seats in con-  
ference nor absent ourselves from the commu-  
nion of the Lords supper without a lawfull  
excuse. Rule 3<sup>rd</sup> We also agree to be ready to  
communicate to the defrauding the church  
expenses and if need be for the support of  
the Ministry

Given the 4<sup>th</sup> We also further agree not to engage in any of the Institutions of man one side of the gospel of christ and do solemnly make a declaration of our fellowship against all of the falsely called benevolent institution of the day such as Missionary Bible tract Temperance societies Sunday school union Society and all other societys that are tributary to the Missionary plan as now existing in the United States of America these things we do covenant and agree to observe and keep sacred in the name of and by the assistance of the Holy trinity. Amen.

7<sup>th</sup>) Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the church, except it be withdrawn by him that made it.






