- 5. Designated all retired Southeastern teachers as "Emeriti Faculty."
- Granted tenure to Dr. Furman Hewitt, Professor of 6. Christian Ethics.
- 7. Appointed Bishop Stephen C. Neill as Visiting Distinguished Teacher - 1985.
- Approved a "Citation for Faculty Excellence." 8.
- Made progress on designating the highest and best use of the seminary's US Highway frontage property. 9.
- Established 6 endowment funds for student aid and 10. student internships.
- 11. Approved a seminary WATS line (telephone).
