This letter constitutes an invitation to you to participate in one of the most significant scholarly projects of the decade. In 1972, the first edition of the INTERNATIONAL SCHOLARS DIRECTORY will be published, providing for the first time a bio-bibliographical listing of noteworthy academicians throughout the world. Although a few national biographical directories of scholars presently exist (e.g., *Kürschners Deutscher Gelehrten-Kalender;* the *Directory of American Scholars*), there is no international directory, we now are in process of filling this lacuna.

Because of your actual or potential international reference interest in the academic community, you are invited to complete the enclosed questionnaire and return it by <u>airmail</u> to the above address. The return of the questionnaire will insure your inclusion in the DIRECTORY. If you do not send us the requested information, we cannot provide an entry for you, for (unlike some biographical publications) the INTERNATIONAL SCHOLARS DIRECTORY will not publish data unverified at the primary source level, i.e., by the scholar to whom those data apply. The questionnaire has been made as succinct as possible and should take you only a few minutes to complete; please return it without delay!

The DIRECTORY is being edited in the English language, to insure its use in the widest circles, but the questionnaire is so constituted that linguistic problems are minimized. Please record book and periodical titles in their <u>original</u> language (do not translate into English); but transliterate them into the roman alphabet, using a standard scheme of transliteration, if you work in a non-roman alphabet (cyrillic, etc.).

No obligation is incurred in returning the questionnaire. To the contrary: for your assistance in supplying data on yourself, we are prepared to make the INTERNATIONAL SCHOLARS DIRECTORY available to you at a significant biographee's discount. We strongly recommend that you take advantage of this offer in conjunction with the return of the questionnaire. It is expected that, because of the editorial labor involved in such a project, the second edition of the DIRECTORY will not appear until 1980; thus, the present, first edition will serve as a basic record of your achievements and widespread reference interest for almost a decade. You will find the ± 1700 page, attractively bound, impeccably edited volume a most valuable source of information on the international scholarly community and a permanent evidence of your own attainments in your chosen field of specialty.

We congratulate you on meriting inclusion in the I.S.D., and look forward to receiving your completed questionnaire.

P.S. If by chance you have already received an invitation to submit biographical data to the INTERNATIONAL SCHOLARS DIRECTORY, please disregard this letter and destroy the enclosed questionnaire (it is strictly personal and should not be passed on to another person). Reception of two invitations, though doubtless a bother, is in fact a compliment: two authoritative sources, entirely independent of each other, recommended your inclusion.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING I.S.D. QUESTIONNAIRE (Numbers correspond to superscripts on the questionnaire)

- 1. Please note that dating is in accord with European, not American practice: the day <u>precedes</u>, rather than follows, the month. E.g. 18/10/31 = October 18, 1931.
- 2. Holders of a second earned doctorate should, however, indicate both <u>if they differ in designation</u>. If you hold more than two earned doctorates, please list only the two of most relevance to your present academic activity. An honorary doctorate should be listed <u>only</u> if no earned degree above B.A. or B.S. is held, and no more than one honorary doctorate should be specified in any case.
- 3. If you are listing an honorary degree (see instruction 2.), please follow it by (h.c.) Example: LL.D. (h.c.) Follow this practice even for degrees which are always granted <u>honoris causa</u> in your country, since they may be earned degrees elsewhere (e.g., the D.D., which is honorary in the U.S., but may be earned in England).
- 4. Use your official professorial position as a guide, and do not specify beyond it. For example, if your title is Prof. of History, write only "History," not "African History" (though this may be your special interest).
- 5. Give titles in the original language of publication, but use the roman alphabet (transliterate into roman characters if necessary); capitalize according to the rules of the language employed. A dissertation title may be substituted for a book title if you wish, but in the case of dissertations, please place double quotation marks ("") around the title to distinguish it as a thesis.
- 6. Code numbers for biographical dictionaries in which you may be included at present (only the most widely known are here listed; please do not make additions to the list):
