NEWARK MAN'S PAINTING OF OLD CHURCH EXHIBITED

NEWARK, Aug. 25.—A painting of the Old Welsh Tract Baptist Church located in Pencader Hundred about two miles from Newark is on exhibition in the window of the Haderer Art Shop, 225 West Ninth St., Wilmington. It was painted by George W. Griffin.

Mr. Griffin in recent years has attracted considerable attention and favorable comment on his paintings of historic buildings of the State and this painting of the old Baptist Church is said to be one of his best works. Mr. Griffin is a retired contractor and it was only in late years that he seriously turned his attention to painting, although he has always been interested in the subject. Recently he painted a picture of the Old Newark Academy here where three signers of the Declaration of Independence attended school. Both of these paintings will eventually be presented by Mr. Griffin to the public school of Newark where a place will be found for them to remain permanently.
