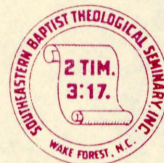

PRE-REGISTRATION... for summer and fall semesters will be held in the Registrar's office April 16 - 30.

GUEST SPEAKER: "Toward Peace in the Middle East," is the title of a lecture to be presented by Dr. Hatem I. Hussaini on Friday, April 18 at 10 AM in Appleby 109. Currently teaching at Shaw University, Dr. Husaini has authored and/or edited books and articles about the Middle East, served in a number of distinguished positions in the field of international diplomacy and is a member of the Palestinian Parliament in exile. Sponsored by the Peace Pilgrimage, all are invited to attend.

KEESEE RECIPIENTS: To receive a full Keesee Scholarship, you must comply with the following regulations set forth by the trustees of the Charles B. Keesee Educational Fund: (1) M.Div., MRE, and MACE students must take 10 hours. (2) A.Div. students must take 12 hours. (3) A student must be taking classes on the Wake Forest seminary campus in order to be eligible for a grant from Keesee. Hours taken at Shelby do not qualify as part of the necessary hours you must take in order to receive Keesee. Students enrolled in CPE or Intern Year Away program do not qualify for any funds from Keesee. (4) Classes must be taken during the full fall or spring semester. Hours taken during Interterm classes and "spring break" or "fall break" classes do not qualify as part of the necessary hours you must take in order to receive Keesee.
