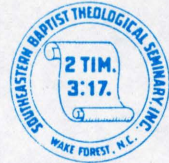

Southeastern Seminary's excavation in  
Israel is now confirmed. The National  
Endowment for the Humanities has approved the grant application made through  
the University of Arizona at Tucson. The Israeli Army has approved the work  
dates of June 8 through July 10. Our plans now are to leave New York on or  
about June 1 and return on July 11 or July 14. This will allow a few days of  
travel in Israel between June 1 and the beginning of work on June 8. All
