

RULES OF DECORUM.

1. The church shall hold at least one meeting for business each month.
2. Every business meeting shall be presided over by a Moderator, who shall be chosen by the church.
3. Business meetings shall be opened by prayer.
4. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to keep order; to put all motions before the church, and announce the vote; to recognize the person who has the right to speak; to decide questions of order; he may speak on any subject being discussed by calling some one to fill his place; in case a vote is evenly divided, he shall give the deciding vote. In the absence of special rules he shall observe such rules as are commonly followed by the presiding officers of public bodies.
5. Members may appeal from the ruling of the Moderator to the church.
6. The church shall choose a Clerk, whose duty it shall be to keep a minute of the proceedings of the church, which shall be read and corrected before the meeting

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adjourns. The minutes shall be correctly and legibly recorded in a substantial book provided by the church for that purpose, in which the Clerk shall also keep a correct list of the members of the church.

7. Each person desiring to speak shall arise and address the Moderator, and proceed only when recognized by the Moderator. No one shall speak more than twice on any one subject without leave of the church.

8. All questions shall be brought before the church by motion and second, and shall be decided by a majority of the members voting, except the receiving of members, granting letters of dismission, choosing a pastor, or setting apart brethren for ordination to the ministry or to the office of deacon, which shall be unanimous.

9. Offences between brethren shall be dealt with as provided in Matt. xviii. 15, 16, 17. Members who have transgressed the rule of life for orderly Christians, or transgressed against the church, should be reproved by the deacons, and may be by any member, and should make acknowledgment before the church. The church may make investigation of reports against the members.

10. The business may be taken up in the following order:

1st. Invite visiting brethren to seats in counsel.

2d. Announce the opportunity for persons to unite with the church.

3d. Call for reference from previous meetings.

4th. Take up matters touching fellowship.

5th. Opportunity given to introduce new business.

11. The deacons of the church shall make report of the funds coming into their hands at the January meeting of each year and at such other times as the church shall require.

12. The Lord's Supper shall be observed \_\_\_\_\_ times each year, at the regular meetings in the months of \_\_\_\_\_

(Some churches observe the Lord's Supper twice and others four times in the year.)

13. The church shall make inquiry as to the cause of members continuing to absent themselves from the meetings of the church.

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14. Members may be received in the following ways:

By experience and baptism.

By letters of dismission from other churches of the same faith and order.

By relation—that is, by satisfying the church that the applicant had membership and good standing in a church in order, but which has ceased to meet, or for other sufficient reason can not grant letters.

By restoring those who have been excluded, satisfaction having been rendered.

15. It is the duty of members to vote on all motions submitted to the church for action.

16. Members who can not from any cause attend the church meetings are expected to write to the church at the regular times for observing the Lord's Supper.

17. These rules may be amended, but notice of proposed change must be submitted at a regular meeting at least one month previous to the time the vote is taken.

Acts xiii. 48. And when the Gentiles heard this they were glad, and glorified the word of the Lord; and as many as were ordained to eternal life believed.

Rom. i. 16. For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ: for it is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth; to the Jew first and also to the Greek.

2 Tim. iii. 16. All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness;

17. That the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works.

#### GOOD WORKS.

XII. We believe that good works, obedience to the commands of God, are well pleasing in his sight, and should be maintained in the church; but they are to be considered only as evidence of a gracious state, and are not a condition of salvation.

Matt. v. 16. Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven.

Luke xvii. 10. So likewise ye, when ye shall have done all those things which are commanded you, say, We are unprofitable servants: we have done that which was our duty to do.

Eph. ii. 8. For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God:

9. Not of works, lest any man should boast.

10. For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them.

Titus iii. 8. This is a faithful saying, and these things I will that thou affirm constantly, that they which have believed in God might be careful to maintain good works. These things are good and profitable unto men.

Heb. x. 24. And let us consider one another to provoke unto love and to good works.

#### CHURCH ORDINANCES.

XIII. We believe that baptism and the Lord's Supper are ordinances appointed by Christ for the church, and they are to be administered only by those who are clothed with authority of the church, having been regularly ordained.

Matt. xxviii. 19. Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost.

Luke xxii. 19. And he took bread and gave thanks, and brake it, and gave unto them, saying. This is my body which is given for you; this do in remembrance of me.

20. Likewise also the cup after supper, saying. This cup is the new testament in my blood, which is shed for you.

There is no record of any administering the ordinances except those who were appointed for this purpose.

#### BAPTISM.

XIV. We believe that baptism is by immersion in water and is to be administered to believers only, and who give evidence of having been regenerated.

Matt. iii. 16. And Jesus, when he was baptized, went up straightway out of the water.

John iii. 23. And John was baptising in Enon near to Salim, because there was much water there.

Acts viii. 37. And Philip said, If thou believest with all thine heart, thou mayest. And he answered and said, I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God.

38. . . . and they went down both into the water, both Philip and the eunuch; and he baptized him.

39. And when they were come up out of the water.

Rom. vi. 4. Therefore we are buried with him by baptism into death.

#### THE LORD'S SUPPER.

XV. We believe that the Lord's Supper should be observed in the church until the coming of Jesus at the end of the world, and that unleavened bread and wine should be used, of which none are to be invited to partake but members of the church and of other churches of like faith and order.

Matt. xxvi. 26. And as they were eating, Jesus took bread, and blessed it, and brake it, and gave it to the disciples, and said, Take eat; this is my body.

27. And he took the cup, and gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying. Drink ye all of it. See also 1 Cor. xi. 23-29.

Matt. xxvi. 17. Now the first day of the feast of unleavened bread the disciples came to Jesus, saying unto him, Where wilt thou that we prepare for thee to eat the passover?

Ex. xiii. 7. Unleavened bread shall be eaten seven days; and there shall no leavened bread be seen with thee, neither shall there be leaven seen with thee in all thy quarters.

From the above it will be seen that the bread was unleavened, for no doubt it was the same bread that was used.

#### MINISTERS TO BE ORDAINED.

XVI. We believe that those who give proof that they are called of God to the ministry, by edifying the church in that exercise, should be ordained by a presbytery and set apart to that work.

Mark iii. 14. And he ordained twelve, that they should be with him, and that he might send them forth to preach.

1 Tim. ii. 7. Whereunto I am ordained a preacher, and an apostle.

1 Tim. iv. 14. Neglect not the gift that is in thee, which was given thee by prophecy, with the laying on of the hands of the presbytery.

#### THE OFFICE OF DEACON.

XVII. We believe that the church should choose members of its body who have the proper qualifications for the office of deacon who are to receive and disburse the funds of the church. They should be set apart to that work by ordination.

Acts vi. 3. Therefore, brethren, look ye out among you seven men of honest report, full of the Holy Ghost and wisdom whom we may appoint over this business.

6. Whom they set before the apostles; and when they had prayed, they laid their hands on them.

See 1 Tim. iii. 8-13 for qualifications of deacons and their wives.

#### FEET WASHING.

(The following article on Feet Washing is not accepted by all Primitive Baptist churches, and the adoption or rejection of it is not made a basis of fellowship.)

XVIII. We believe that washing the saints' feet is an example of Jesus Christ to be observed by the church.

John xiii. 4 He riseth from supper, and laid aside his garments; and took a towel, and girded himself.

5. After that he poureth water into a basin, and began to wash the disciples' feet, and to wipe them with the towel wherewith he was girded.

14. If I then your Lord and Master, have washed your feet, ye also ought to wash one another's feet.

15. For I have given you an example, that ye should do as I have done to you.

# Articles of Faith

3.

- 3 1<sup>st</sup> We believe there is one self-existent God denominated in the scriptures the Father Son and Holy Ghost and these three are one
- 2<sup>nd</sup> We believe that the scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by Divine inspiration of God: and that they are the commanding rule of faith and practice for the Church.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> We believe that God made man upright and gave him a law which he transgressed and thus fell from his uprightness and became and became sinful; and that his posterity are totally depraved: inclined to evil: and that the just demerit of his sin is eternal punishment, and that the only way of salvation from sin and misery is by the grace of God through the vicarious atonement of Jesus Christ
- 4<sup>th</sup> We believe that God before the foundation of the world chose his church or people in Christ, first to holiness or salvation from sin secondly to happiness or the enjoyment of himself.
- 5 We believe that the justification of God's elect is through the imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ.
- 6 We believe that the grace of God is communicated to his people by the power of the Holy Ghost, and is called in the scriptures the new birth, and it effects a change of the affections and will or powers of the soul from the love of sin

to a love of holiness

7<sup>th</sup> We believe in the final preservation of all the regenerate though they may fall into sin by temptation. They shall be brought back again with weeping as David and Peter and others

8<sup>th</sup> We believe that Christian baptism is immersion in the name of the Father Son and Holy Ghost and is required to gospel obedience, and that it should be administered by none except a regular administrator of our faith and order, and that those who profess faith in Jesus Christ and give evidence of a gracious change of heart are the only proper subjects for the ordinance.

9<sup>th</sup> We believe that the Lords supper is an institution of Christ, designed for his Church and that no person has a right thereto until baptized on profession of his faith and united to a gospel church.

10<sup>th</sup> We believe that the first day of the week should be kept sacred to the memory of Christs resurrection, and that the whole of it should be devoted to the public and private duties of religion.

11<sup>th</sup> We believe that the Son of God will come to judge the world in righteousness, and that there will be a resurrection <sup>both</sup> of the just and the un-just and that God will then make a final separation between the the righteous and the wicked.

# Articles of Covenant.

15

- X<sup>1st</sup> To covenant to walk together in love and harmony; to watch over each other for good and suffering sin upon each other, but to admonish each other for good to love and good works, that our conversation may redound to the glory of God
- 2<sup>nd</sup> To pray for each other and for the ingathering of the Church, to bear each others burdens and so fulfill the law of Christ
- 3<sup>rd</sup> To deal with tenderness with each other not discovering their infirmities to any within or without contrary to the rule given in the gospel.
- 4<sup>th</sup> To contend by a well ordered life and conversation in the truth for the faith once delivered to the saints: endeavouring to keep the unity of the spirit in the bond of peace
- 5<sup>th</sup> To communicate to our Elder or Pastor according to his necessities and our abilities God having so ordained that those who preach the gospel should live of the gospel, also to contribute to the poor and other contingent expences of the Church as God has given us ability
- 6<sup>th</sup> To shun all places of vanity and keep ourselves unspotted from the world, to love mercy, deal justly and walk humbly and wisely toward them that are without.
- 7<sup>th</sup> To endeavour to worship God daily by reading the scriptures and praying in our families, in public and private as duty is made knowne
- 8<sup>th</sup> To keep all private concerns of the Church

and not relate them to the world remem-  
bering the Church is a fountain sealed, a  
spring shut up

9<sup>th</sup> That Brother shall not go to law with  
Brother, but that all difficulties shall be set-  
tled in the Church in the spirit of meek-  
ness, according to divine rule

10<sup>th</sup> All which duties we desire to be  
found in the performance of through the  
gracious direction of the holy spirit; whilst  
we both admire and adore that grace which  
has given us a name and a place in  
God's house better than that of Sons and Da-  
ughters.

### Rules for Receiving Members.

1<sup>st</sup> We covenant to receive members on  
relation of their experience befor they are bap-  
tized; or if after, we require that they give us  
satisfactory evidence that they have been  
baptized on profession of their faith by a  
regular ordained and acknowledged Minister  
of our faith and order.

2 We covenant that the person or persons who  
offer themselves to the Church shall give sat-  
isfactory evidence of a new birth, sound mind  
in the doctrine and a regular and peaceable life

3 We covenant that when any one offers for mem-  
bership the Church shall ask such questions  
as they shall think proper. They shall by

the Moderator call a vote and if said vote be unanimous, the person who offers is received, if the vote be not unanimous they shall wait until the Church is all agreed.

(United we stand divided we fall)

4<sup>th</sup> We covenant to restore excluded members by a unanimous vote when the difficulty may have been removed for which they were excluded. Nevertheless should an individual member raise an objection to any candidate they shall render to the Church satisfactory reason for such objection or become the subject of labour themselves unless they withdraw their objection.

### Dealing with Members

We covenant to take for our guide the rules as laid down in the XVIII Chapter of Matthew.

### Special Church Business Meeting

The Church shall meet as duty may require to settle all difficulties or transact any other business that may be necessary, when a true record shall be kept of all the business done in these meetings.

No person shall be admitted but members of the same body, or called as witnesses or Brethren from a sister church that may be invited by the Moderator of said meeting.

of this kind the savior does not say go and try to be reconciled, but it is a positive command go and be reconciled to thy brother neither does the savior say endeavor to be reconciled no but it is go and be reconciled, neither does the savior say go and try to get thy brother reconciled to your ways but the command is go and be reconciled to thy brother I understand that you are to go and be reconciled to your brother ways as you have offended him it is not for you to try and get him to come to you but you must conform to him this is the saviors rule and when ever we try to change it we are leaving jesus and the gospel order of the church, Now we know that Brother Brees left his gift at the alter and we also know that Brother Brees has not bin reconciled to Sister Sauer as the savior has commanded, And now the church has taken it up contrary to the law or command of Christ and have made a motion and seconded

That the Church restore Brother Brees to the liberty of the Church. The record will show that Brother Brees left his gift at the alter.

[I will state here that as far as this is concerned is a step in the right direction but it never was completed] but has never as yet fulfilled the Savior command and I consider the Church is out of place in what she has done it is not in accordance with the order of the Church of Christ

Therefore I consider the Church has left us. A second was made to this motion referred to above and a vote taken for the Church not to receive this forgoing admonition. Only five members present two voted the rest did not vote
