

HELD WITH THE CHURCH AT GREENFIELD WEAKLEY COUNTY, TENNESSEE OCTOBER 18, 19 and 20, 1907



GREENFIELD-PHILESIC ASSOCIATION

FIRST DAY-FRIDAY

Met with the Regular Primitive Baptist church of Christ at Greenfield, Weakley county, Tenn., on Friday before the third Sunday in October, 1907.

After singing Elder J. N. Wallace offered prayer, after which Elder J. C. Ross preached the introduc-

tory sermon, using Romans v. 21 as a text.

After a short intermission the church came together by singing, and proceeded in the following order:

Invited visiting brethren and sisters of our faith and order to seats with us.

Called for reference. None.

Inquired for the peace of the church. All in peace and fellowship.

Gave an opportunity for the reception of members.

None received.

Called for new business.

There being no further business in the regular order, the letters from the different churches composing the association were called for and read and names of messengers enrolled, as shown in statistical table

Called for petitionary letters from churches wishing to represent with us, when a letter was handed in

from Bethel church, Graves county, Ky., which was received and the names of the messengers enrolled. See table.

Called for corresponding letters from sister asso-

ciations as follows:

Obion—Letter and minutes by the hands of Elder J. W. Arnold and Brethren W. H. Olive and G. J. G. Thomason.

Big Sandy—Letter and minutes by the hands of Elders R. C. Taylor, J. L. Butler and L. D. Hamilton and Brethren Jesse Gwaltney, J. E. Fields, W. C.

Butler and Jim Gwaltney.

Forked Deer--No letter or minutes. Elder J. B. Halbrook and Brethren L. J. Law, Willie Blackburn, J. B. Wright, J. D. Baker and G. L. Cooper were present.

Predestinarian—Letter and minutes by the hands of Elders D. Hopper and J. W. Lomax and Brother S.

E. Johnson.

Soldier Creek—Letter, but no minutes, by the hands of Elder L. F. Wallace and Brother Frank Sullivan.

West Tennessee—Letter and minutes by the hands

of Elder J. A. Adams and Brother J. M. Yates.

Called for petitionary corresponding letters.

Agreed that the deacons of this church, with other deacons present, act as a committee on preaching.

Prayer by Elder D. Hopper.

SECOND DAY—SATURDAY

Met according to adjournment. Prayer by Elder L. F. Wallace.

Renewed the call for petitionary corresponding letters. A letter was presented from the Muddy River Association, in Illinois, by Elder C. F. Stuckey, which was received, and the hand of fellowship extended to Brother Stuckey by the moderator.

Renewed the call for corresponding letters. Elder J. Stallings came in today from the Forked Deer.

Agreed to read the general corresponding letter. printed in the minutes of Muddy River Association.

Called for report of committee on finance, who

reported \$19.00 received from the churches.

Called for the reading of the corresponding letter to sister associations, which was read and ordered printed in our minutes; and agreed that we write a special letter to the Muddy River in acceptance of their letter and correspondence.

Appointed brethren to bear correspondence to

sister associations as follows:

Big Sandy, when convened with the church at New Hope, Gibson county, Tenn., four miles east of Milan, beginning on Friday before the first Sunday in September, 1908, Elders J. C. Ross, W. T. Jackson and A. B. Ross, and Brethren F. M. Campbell and J. C. Caudle.

Forked Deer, when convened with the church at Harmony, five miles east of Bradford, beginning on Friday before the second Sunday in September, 1908, Elders K. M. Myatt and C. H. Cayce and Brother W. T. Campbell.

Obion, when convened with the church at Union, eight miles east of Gleason, Tenn., on Friday before the fourth Sunday in September, 1908, Elder A. B. Ross and Brethren W. N. Tucker and A. O. Insco.

Predestinarian, when convened with the church at Little Hatchie, Chester county, Tenn., nine miles southwest of McNairy station, beginning on Saturday before the fourth Sunday in September, 1908, Elder

C. H. Cayce and Brother D. W. Harrison.

Soldier Creek, when convened with the church at Harmony, Graves county, Ky., one mile south of Farmington, and nine miles from Mayfield, beginning on Friday, before the second Sunday in October, 1908, Elders A. B. Ross and C. H. Cayce and Brethren W. D. Morgan and W. T. Easley.

West Tennessee, when convened with the church at Willow Springs, Hickman county. Tenn., four miles south of Lyles station, beginning on Saturday before the third Sunday in September, 1908, Elders K. M. Myatt, C. H. Cayce.

Muddy River, when convened with the church at Wolf Creek, Saline county, Ill., near Eldorado, on the Big Four and I. C. railroads, beginning on Friday before the first Sunday in September, 1908, Elders K.

M. Myatt, C. H. Cayce and W. E. Brush.

Agreed to hold the next session of our association with the church at Bethel, Graves county, Ky., nine miles east of Fulton, beginning on Friday before the third Sunday in October, 1908.

Our next union meeting will be held with the church at Shiloh, two miles north of Dresden, Weak-ley county, Tenn., beginning on Friday before the

fifth Sunday in May, 1908.

Agreed to request the churches to say in their next letter to the association if they favor dropping the word "Philesic" from our name, so that the association may be known by the name of Greenfield Association.

Agreed to have 800 copies of these minutes printed

and to reserve 175 for corresponding purposes.

Agreed to tender our thanks to the brethren, sisters and friends of Greenfield and vicinity for their kindness and hospitality to us while among them.

FORM OF GOVERNMENT

The plan of organization and manner of conducting an association having been previously discussed and virtually agreed upon by the churches, the first session of the Greenfield Association was held with the church at Greenfield, Weakley county, Tenn., Friday, Saturday and Sunday, November 10, 11 and 12, 1899, when and where a form of government was agreed upon, which, having since been somewhat amended, is now as follows:

1. We agree that the pastor of the church with which each association, or general meeting is held, preach the introduc-

tory sermon.

2. That the moderator and clerk of the church with which each general meeting or association is held be moderator and

clerk of said meeting.
3. That all the business transacted be done in the name and by authority of the church with which the meeting is held, after said church (with which any such meeting or association is held) has disposed of her usual order of business, and that we have no articles of faith or rules of decorum except those of the church with which the association is held. But that all the messengers and visiting brethren, from any of the churches, shall have an equal voice in all matters coming before the body.

4. That no act which concerns the churches in general shall be passed, or acted upon by the association until the same has

been referred to the churches for their consideration.

5. That the church with which each association is held, appoint, in any way they see proper, ministers to fill the stand during the meeting.


We agree that this association of churches be known or designated by name as the Greenfield Association of Regular

Primitive Baptists (now Greenfield-Philesic).

7. That the churches composing the association represent by letter and messengers, but that all visiting brethren from the sister churches have the same, or equal, privilege with the messengers.
