





# Meet the Man

April 29 1:30 - 2:30 p.m.

There will be a Student Forum next Wednesday, April 29, in Binkley Chapel from 1:30 - 2:30 p.m. for students to meet and ask questions of Dr. Paige Patterson. Dr. Patterson is the person the Presidential Search Committee is recommending to be Southeastern's 5th President.

All students are invited and encouraged to attend.

The following statement was delivered in Chapel by Dr. Paige Patterson to the Faculty, Staff and Student Body at Criswell College on April 21,1992.

Last Thursday, April 16, I received a call from Pastor Roger Ellsworth, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary in Wake Forest, North Carolina, informing me that the Presidential Search Committee had just voted unanimously to recommend to the full board that I be elected as president of Southeastern Seminary.

Having known of this possibility for several weeks my wife, Dorothy, and our children have joined me in diligently seeking the face of God to ascertain His will for our lives and ministries. In these days of spiritual searching and agonizing, the Book of Jeremiah the prophet has become especially precious to me. Though I am aware that Jeremiah said nothing about Southeastern Seminary, North Carolina, or, for that matter, my own life, I am one who is convinced that through the reading of God's word, the Holy Spirit often invokes the timeless phrases of ancient recorded events in order to cast light on our own circumstances and sometimes even to reveal His will.

A few days ago in my devotional time, my eyes crossed the familiar admonition of Jeremiah 6:16. "Thus says the Lord: Stand in the ways and see, and ask for the old paths where the good way is, and walk in it; that you will find rest for your souls."

Reference to "the old paths" reminded me of the labor of North Carolina's first Baptist preacher—Paul Palmer. He entered North Carolina in 1720 and began an itinerant ministry of evangelism and church planting. Evangelist Palmer was so anointed of God that nine years later Governor Everhard wrote to the Bishop of London complaining about the spread of Baptists, saying that he was "powerless to prevent or withstand the great tide of religious enthusiasm which under the preaching of Palmer was sweeping over the province."

As I thought of Palmer and those early North Carolina churches with such appealing names as Tar River, Bear Creek, Lower Fishing Creek, Sandy Run, Kehukee, and Shiloh, I found the prospect of returning to these "old paths"—not just the places but also the faith and the fervor of Paul Palmer and others like him, to be a challenging and exciting opportunity.

Accordingly, yesterday I called Chairman Ellsworth and shared with him my conviction that, if elected by the Board of Trustees when they meet on May 14, 1992, God had freed me and indeed called me to accept the Search Committee's invitation to become the fifth President of Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary. This I will do, if elected, with full awareness of the sacredness and magnitude of the task, the sacrificial labors of many who have traversed these paths before me, my own limitations, and the abundant provisions and enabling power of Almighty God. May God be pleased to take the meager offerings of my life and talents and once again multiply them as He did the loaves and fishes on the Galilean hillside in order that the spiritual hunger of the multitudes might be satisfied.
