ADJUNCTIVE FACULTY
APPOINTMENT:

Dr. Fred Horton, Associate Professor of Religion at Wake Forest University has been appointed visiting associate professor of New Testament for the Spring Semester. Dr. Horton will assume responsibilities for the courses B 132 (1) Survey of the New Testament (11 TWF) and B 248 The Epistle to the Romans (9 TWF) which were to have been taught by Dr. Raymond B. Brown. The scheduling of these courses remains unchanged. Dr. Horton is a native of Roanoke, Virginia, a graduate of UNC-Chapel Hill, Union Theological Seminary-New York and Duke University (Ph.D) and has taught at Wake Forest since 1970. He is currently on leave from Wake Forest and is a visiting scholar at Duke University.

SUMMER DIG NOTE:

In spite of our best efforts, we have been unable to get a satisfactory contract for an excavation in Israel this summer (1978). President Lolley has suggested that we start an immediate investigation and planning for the summer, 1979. Progress on this effort will be updated through the Campus Bulletin.
