1st. The introductory sermon was preached by Elder D. R. Moore, from Luke 14:16–24.

Blalock, James S. Dameron were appointed to attend another at Dutchville, commencing on Friday before the fourth Sunday in April 1889.

17th. The Circular Letter prepared by Elder James A. Burch was read and adopted.

18th. Brother S. J. Hall was appointed to write a Circular Letter for next year.

19th. Elders James A. Burch, T. Y. Monk, Y. I. Chandler were appointed as a Presbytery to attend to the request of Big Meadow church to inquire into the qualifications of Brother W. C. Jones as Minister of the Gospel, and if they think proper to set him apart to said work.

20th. We the Country Line Association forbid every species of traffic and all other disorder within legal bounds of our Association during the entire meeting, and offenders may expect to be prosecuted to the extent of the laws of North Carolina.

CIRCULAR LETTER.

In obedience to the brethren composing the Country Line Baptist Association held with the church at Lickfork, Rockingham county, N. C., August 1887, as it was their mind to appoint me to write a Circular Letter to be inspected by them at their next meeting, and if found worthy, give it a place in their Minutes, while I feel myself insufficient for the task, yet in my weakness I will make the attempt. The subject that appears to my mind for 'he occasion is, "One Lord, one faith, one baptism;" Ephesians 4:5. The Apostle was addressing the church of God, in which he declares himself to be an Apostle of Jesus Christ in all the letters that he wrote to the Church, situated at Rome, Corinth, Galatia, Ephesus, Philippi.

Colosse, Thessalonica, also to Timothy, Titus, and . Philemon, saying grace be to you, and peace, from God our Father, and from the Lord Jesus Christ. We see very plainly that there was only one Lord, one faith, one baptism taught by the Apostle to all the saints of God above named. He taught them in the name and doctrine of the Father, Son and Holy Ghost to endeavor to keep the unity of the spirit in the bond of peace, teaching them there is one body, and one spirit, even as ye are called in one hope of your calling. He did not teach them lords many, faiths many and baptisms many, as the religious world had them then, and as they have them now. The Primitive Saints believed and practised our text in the ages in which they lived, and from that time down through all ages to the present do they believe the same thing, because they have all been called by the the same power, and they all live in one hope of their calling, while others may trust in the wisdom, prudence, and all the high exalted institutions of human origin, and of human authority, hold to them and carry them with them into their organizations, and by them the power of God is denied. Yet to us there is but one God, the Father, of whom are all things, and we in him, and one Lord Jesus Christ, by whom are all things, and we by him. Now brethren, the religious world think it strange that the old order of Baptists will not hold in their fellowship the good institutions of the world, that are of such great benefit to mankind, while living in the world that they can enjoy so well, and boast of so much, but we can only say this in reply, that while we obey the teaching of our text, we cannot obey lords many, faiths many and baptisms many; so we can only say to all, as we would that all men's hearts were right in the sight of God, if according to his will, and that according to the word of God. By as much of the ways of the world, its institutions, conventions, societies, missions, or any thing of human origin or from human authority that we profess to carry into the kingdom of God, as the church of the true and loving God, the pillar and ground of the truth, by so much do we say to God, by our acts, that he is not

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able, without these things, to do all his pleasure, that his power is limited and dependent to a certain extent upon the acts of the creature; so we would rob him of his glory by contending that his power or Spirit is not sufficient to rule his kingdom, and bring to himself all the father gave to him. Then brethren, let us stick to the text.

Never let it once be told that truth by us was ever sold. May the God of Heaven enable us so to live in this life that we may love and fear him so as never to distrust his name, and that we through his name may fight the good fight of faith, and lay hold on eternal life which is the gift of God; and we hope to be able to feel that when the time of our departure is at hand that there is a crown of righteousness laid up for us that the Lord, the righteous judge, will give to us at that day, and not to us only, but to them also that love his appearing. Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to his mercy he hath saved us, by the washing of regeneration, and the renewing of the Holy Ghost. May the God of all grace sustain and uphold all his, in all their afflictions and temptations, and his name receive all the praise. Peace be unto you. Amen.
