STEERING COMMITTEE OF THE WOMEN'S RESOURCE CENTER

In a delightful interview with Ethel Lee, chair of the Steering Committee of The Women's Resource Center of Southeastern Seminary, I learned where she sees The Center now, and her vision for it for the future.

Service is a major part of what the Women's Resource Center (WRC) is all about - service to all women - women who serve in voluntary or professional capacities and who are ordained or who are not ordained. Part of this service includes collecting information - information about where women graduates are, what their ministry is, whether or not they are ordained. The WRC is also a collecting center for ordination sermons, academic papers written by and/or about women, and a library for use by women and men.

Ethel feels the priorities of the WRC are to build an understanding between women and men, to build an appreciation of each other's gifts, and to value one another. In order to achieve these goals we need consciousness-raising and education on the part of women and men; support from women and men - real support, not just verbal pats on the head; persons who are willing to risk discovering and knowing the issues, even though the process is painful; and communication among women and men regarding issues about women. Real needs for the WRC right now are financial support, understanding support, and people support.

Her vision for the future of the WRC includes offering peer-counseling for women and sponsoring conferences and seminars for and about women. She would like to have a "come-let's-get-to-know-one-another" gathering in the fall for women and men interested in the concerns of women in ministry. She would also like to hear from women graduates concerning their particular needs.

In working toward changing the view of women in ministry, it is wise to move slowly. When one works toward changing a system one is going to get reaction - some of it will be hostile, cruel - some uninformed and patronizing - some accepting and affirming. To maintain identity while continuing to go through change is the real test.



ANNOTATED BIBLIOGRAPHY: BOOKS OF SPECIAL INTEREST "PARENTING, PEACE, JUSTICE". By Nancy Peebles, United Church of Christ Southern Region Program Associates for Parent-Child Relationships; Senior, M.Div. SEBTS.

- + Mel Williams and Mary Ann Brittain, Christian Education in Family Clusters (Judson Press, 1982) \$6.95. A collection of the curriculum materials used by a Family Cluster at Pullen Memorial Baptist Church. The materials include Bible study and a whole lot more for an intergenerational setting of thirty-eight sessions. Being personally acquainted with the authors may possibly prejudice me a little, but I think this is excellent and very usable material!
- + Westcott, Burkle, Koopman, and Seitz, Home, Resources for Family Sharing (Paulist Press, 1978) \$4.95.

 Based on the Liturgical year, this book presents suggestions for Bible study, activities, and discussions for the family to do together. It is printed in calendar format, with 52 "sessions" that could be used in sequence or for celebration of important family events. It would take several times on each topic to exhaust all the suggestions. Good for families with varying ages.
- + Lois Peeler and Larry Kalp, editors, Birth, Baptism and Parenting Resources (United Church Press, 1983). I think these are useful in a variety of settings for looking at various aspects of communication, worship resources, pastoral care for families in various stages, etc. Differences in theology and doctrine may cause some people problems, but these materials could at least spark some discussion and thought in the areas presented.

 \$\frac{\$17.95}{\$17.95}\$ per year. Articles on timely issues for the family, suggestions for family share times, weekly "meditations" for couples, are just some of the things given each month in this magazine format. Good for use of clergy, excellent for use by laity.
- + Marriage and Family Living, St. Meinrad Archabbey, St. Meinrad, Indiana 45777. \$11.00 per year. Book reviews, monthly family night suggestions, discussion starters and issue oriented articles are some of the helps found in this magazine. Although edited with the Catholic families in mind, it is by no means exclusive.
- + Family Festivals, 160 East Virginia St., #290, San Jose CA 95112. \$16.00 per year. Book reviews, articles dealing with celebrations--historical and modern--from around the world, and a "centerfold" calendar are some of what you can find in each 'bimonthly' issue. Suggestions for adding new traditions and celebrations to the family's existence are abounding.
