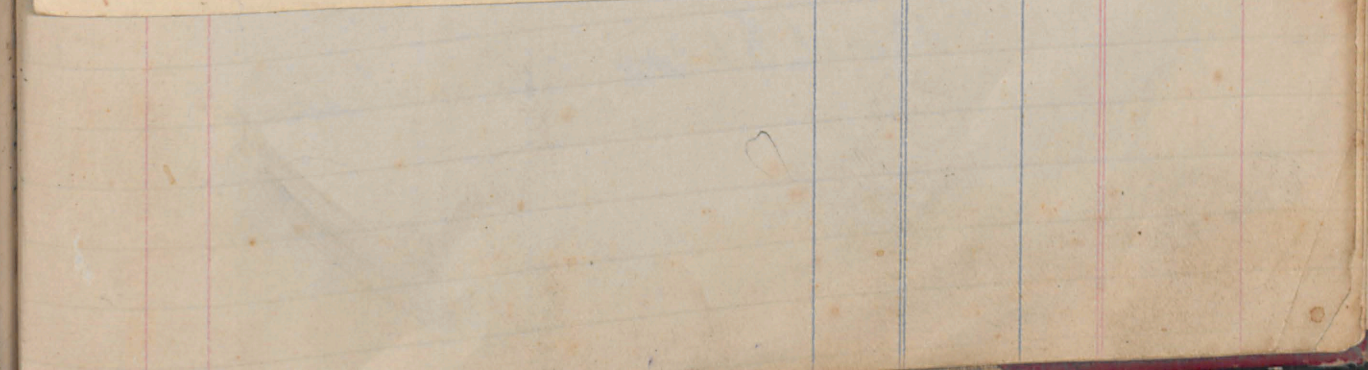
Dear Sir
