Graduation exercises were held on campus May 10-11. Dr. Clyde Fant GRADUATION preached the baccalaureate sermon and Dr. William GRADUATION Clemmons delivered the charge to the graduates. The 188 spring graduates, coupled with 105 others who graduated in December, brings the total Southeastern alumni to 5540. Construction continues on schedule for the Ledford Student Center. The brick work for the new additions is well underway. Demolition has been completed and LEDFORD CENTER clean up finished. The soundness of construction in the old gym has been remarkable. Several special courses have been underway since the end of the spring semester. Among these are Practicum in World Missions (Washington DC) led by Dr. George Braswell; Practicum in Urban Evangelism (Charlotte, PRAXIS NC) led by Dr. Delos Miles. Three others are scheduled next month: Practicum in Home Missions, The Southern Baptist Convention (Dallas, TX), and Field Archaeology (Israel). In response to a call to prayer issued by the Southern Baptist state convention presidents, there was a special prayer service held on campus in Appleby Chapel on Sunday, May 19.
