The first Missionary Day of the fall semester will be held Tuesday, September 12, with Dr. Robert G. Bratcher as the guest speaker. Dr. Bratcher has been a research associate in the Translations Department of the American Bible Society since 1957 and prepared the basic draft of the "Good News for Modern Man." He also served as chairman of the team of seven scholars who prepared the translation of the Old Testament in Today's English Version. Dr. Bratcher is a Th.M. and Th.D graduate of Southern Seminary and served as a missionary of the S.B.C. Foreign Mission Board.

SCHOLARSHIP ACCOUNTS:

Students who expect to receive grant or scholarship aid and wish to use these funds to purchase books may obtain them at discounted prices by listing them temporarily with the store and paying the account by September 29. In order to do this, the student must have one of three accounts- Baptist Book Store, Master Charge or Bank Americard/Visa. Students who do not have one of these accounts must fill out an application for a Baptist Book Store account before books can be obtained. Book accounts are not automatically deducted from aid funds and must be paid directly to the store by the student. There will be no extension of the September 29 date and books for which payment has not been received will be charged to the indicated account at full price.

P.O. BOXES:

During this week only, seminary mailboxes will be rented in the post office in Mackie Hall from 10:30-11:00 a.m. and from 3:00-4:00 p.m. Tuesday through Friday. Also, stamps will be sold in the post office at these times. After September 8, these services will return to the Soda Shop.
