

MINUTES

October 7th, 1927.

The Association was held with New Home Church, Friday before the Second Sunday in October, 1927.

The Introductory Sermon was preached by Rev. W. D. Carroll, from 133rd Psalm, first verse: "Behold how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity.

After an intermission of one hour and 30 minutes, the Associaticn was called to order by the Moderator of the last Association – Rev. W. M. Lawhon. Prayer by Rev. George Revell.

The Association then elected Rev. R. J. Carraway Moderator, and H. C. Rehwinkel, Jr., Clerk.

It was moved and carried then we call for correspondence from sister churches, and received eight letters, which were read and on motion the letters, with the messengers, were received.

Moved and carried we send fifty copies of our minutes to West Florida Association.

The Association then adjourned until 9:30 o'clock Saturday morning.

SATURDAY MORNING

On motion the Moderator was authorized to appoint two ministers to represent this Association at the West Florida Association at its next session.

The Moderator appointed Rev. C. C. Scarborough and Rev. John McKenzie, and on motion they were instructed to invite a corresponding delegation from West Florida Association.

It was moved and carried we hold the next session of the Asscciation with Lake Jackson Church, Tallahassee, Florida, Star Route, Leon County, Florida.

On motion the minutes of this association were read and adopted.

TREASURER'S REPORT

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON CONSTITUTION AND ORDER, AT BEULAH CHURCH, WAKULLA COUNTY, FLORIDA, OCTOBER 3, 1874.

The cause of this Constitution was not for convenience from geographical situation, nor from enmity to any of our sister churches or brethren, nor from a feeling of exclusiveness or selfishness or desire to be let alone, nor from a difference of opinion with our brethren or a disbelief of the long established doctrines and usages of the old Baptist, as to add or detract from the commandments, nor with a view of severing the Church of Christ into another fragment, or setting up another religious sect, thereby weakening the cause of our Master, already enfeebled by divisions and lessening the power and influence of the Gospel by trying to force nice distinctions, thus substituting ourselves and affording to others a pretext to substitute a system of perverse disputing and disgraceful wrangling for the simplicity of Christ's revealed will as taught in His word. We do rather pray for unity and a healing of the breaches already made. But we have been thrown into a dilemma, either to submit to the exclusion and unchurching of a part of our body directly, and all of us ultimately, and suspend all religious services as in the fear of God, asserting the sovereignty of the church and meeting together in a church and associational capacity for our inutual comfort and edification. We believe that the cause of truth demands that we adopt the latter alternative, assured from an intimate acquaintance with our sister Elim, that she has not nor had not departed from the faith of God's elect, and that her exclusion from the Ocklocknee Association under the above charge, and the dropping of our sister Mt. Zion for endorsing her supposed departure, was in the highest sense justified by facts associational, constitutional or scriptural, and a lamentable disregard of Ephesians 4 and 3. The order of this Association and of the churches of which she is composed is preserved unchanged in any particular, being that of the Primitive Baptists all over the world, to-wit: Salvation by grace through faith, which is the gift of God, Ephesians 2:8; that a church is a body of immerse d believers, Acts 2:41, who only are entitled to the ordinances of the Lord's Supper and washing ot the Saints' feet, John 13; together with the Articles of Faith and Rules of Decorum, common to our people, which we omit in this provisional minute.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. We believe in only one true and living God, and that there are three in the Godhead, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost, Isaiah 44:8; 45:21; 1 John 5:7; 1 Cor. 8:6.

2. We believe the Scriptures of the Old and New Testament are the Word of God, and the only rule of faith and practice. II Tim. 3:16.

3. We believe in the doctrine of election of grace. Titus 3:7.

4. We believe in one Lord, one Faith and one Baptism. Ephes. 4:5.

5 We believe in man's impotency to recover himself from the state he is in by nature of his own free will and ability. John 5:7.

6. We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God only by the imputed righteousness of Christ. I Peter 2:24; Isaiah 53:5.

7. We believe that God's elect shall be called, regenerated and sanctified by the Holy Ghost. Romans 15:16 and 8:30; II Thes. 2:13; II Peter 1:2.

8. We believe the faithful shall grow in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. II Peter 3:18; Colos. 1:10.

9. We believe that Baptism, the Lord's Supper and the Washing of Feet are the only subjects of these ordinances, and that the only mode of baptism is by immersion. Mat. 28:19; I Cor. 24 to 26; St. John 13:14; I Tim. 5:10; Mat. 3:16.

10. We believe the punishment of the wicked shall be everlasting, and the joy of the righteous shall be eternal. Mat. 25:46.

11. We believe that no minister has the right to the administration of the ordinances only such as are regularly called and come under the imposition of the hand's of the Presbytery. I Tim. 4:14.

12. We believe in the resurrection of the dead and a general judgment. Rev. 20:5; Rom. 14:10.
