Forty units are occupied. The remaining 16 units will not be leased until STUDENT


APARTMENTS the permanent street has been completed. The contractors are in place working on

The Board of Trustees met on campus October 15-16. Among their actions were the following:

TRUSTEES

- 1. Elevated Bob Spinks to Assistant to the President: Financial Development. Designated Rod Byard Assistant to the President: Communications.
- Increased automobile mileage allowance to 18¢/mile and raised moving expenses for faculty and administrative officers to an amount up to \$3,000.00.
- 3. Increased the basic matriculation fee from \$150/ semester to \$175/semester beginning the fall semester, 1980. (This action is in accord with the increase in all the SBC Seminaries).
- 4. Recommended a possible revision of the seminary Charter to insure that every qualified State Convention be represented on the Board of Trustees.
- 5. Approved plans for the Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary Conference on Biblical Authority, January 29-30, 1980. The Conference is scheduled on campus and will feature Dr. Herschel Hobbs.
- 6. Elected Dr. Thomas H. Graves Assistant Professor of Philosophy of Religion.
- 7. Conferred academic tenure upon Dr. Glenn T. Miller, Associate Professor of Church History.
- 8. Conferred upon Dr. James E. Tull the title, "Professor Emeritus of Theology."
- 9. Increased second mortgage loans from \$6,000 to \$10,000 for ten years at 6%.
- 10. Approved plans for the painting of the exterior of Binkley Chapel.
- 11. Established the Howard Williams Memorial Scholarship Endowment Fund.
- 12. Elected the following officers for 1979-80
