"Christian Truth in an Age of Relativism" is the theme of three lectures to be given on Southeastern campus, Thursday, October 1, and Friday, October 2. Dr. Charles U. Harris, President Emeritus of Seabury-Western Theological Seminary, will give the first lecture Thursday afternoon at 3:00. The second lecture will be presented Thursday evening at 8:00 by Dr. Chevis F. Horne, Visiting Professor of Preaching at Southeastern Seminary and Pastor Emeritus, First Baptist Church, Martinsville, Va. Dr. James Ralph Scales, President of Wake Forest University, will deliver the concluding lecture Friday morning at 10:00. All the lectures will be given in Binkley Chapel. The public is invited - especially seminarians, pastors and those interested in interpreting Christian truths in our times. This is the fifth series of the James Montgomery Hester Lectures in Christian philosophy and is conducted under the sponsorship of Wake Forest University. The lectures were established by Dr. Hester in honor of Dr. A. C. Reid, retired professor of philosophy at Wake Forest currently residing in the town of Wake Forest.
