The Charlotte phase begins May 15.

SPECIAL CAMPAIGN

The Lilly Endowment and the Arthur Vining Davis Foundation joined with the Albans Institute to sponsor a consultation on "The Futures of Protestant Seminaries" in Chicago, April 24-25. President Lolley was among those invited to participate. A wide range of insights were gained regarding theological education during the 1980's and 1990's.
