TRAVEL GRANTS FOR
ISRAEL STUDY:President Lolley has just announced that SEBTS has re-
ceived \$10,000 from the Dorot Foundation for travel
grants for study in Israel in the summer of 1985. In
addition, the Seminary has received contributions to be used in support of our
summer program in archaeology at Ekron Miqne. The cost of this summer program
at the moment is \$2,184.50, not including weekend expenses and an anticipated
increase in the airfare to Israel. Interested students should pick up travel
grant and summer program application forms from the Dean's Office as soon as
possible. The dates of the summer program are June 17-August 2, 1985. Additional
details are available from Drs. Balentine and Durham. Application deadline is
March 15, 1985 but students are encouraged to apply as soon as possible.
