The Southeastern Seminary Development Council held its second meeting on campus October 2-3. Enthusiasm ran high and the Council adopted unanimously a development plan to

These persons, once informed about the school, will become the initial reservoir for participation in the fundraising campaign to be launched later.

The Southeastern Trustees held their semi-annual meeting on campus October 10-11. The following TRUSTEES actions were taken:

- 1. Adopted Master Campus Plan.
- 2. Adopted a Personnel Handbook.
- 3. Revised certain music instruction fees.
- 4. Adopted a \$150 per semester Cooperative Program Supplement Fee for students other than Southern Baptists beginning Fall semester, 1978.
- 5. Adopted a 15¢ per mile Mileage Allowance for travel on Seminary business.
- 6. Increased housing allowance for ordained persons to \$7200 maximum annually. (August 1, 1977)
- 7. Revised Seminary Cemetery Policy so that persons who resigned from the Seminary after twelve years of uninterrupted service are eligible to retain lot (s).
- 8. Instructed the Administration to study the Seminary Annuity Program and report to the March meeting of the Trustees.
- 9. Ratified the ballot by mail, August 24, 1977, to elect Drs. Hewitt and Dale to the Faculty.
- Approved a plan possibly to award an Excellence in Ministry Citation at the Spring Commencement, 1978.
- 11. Approved distribution of \$46,849.91 from 1976-77 Cooperative Program Challenge Funds.
- 12. Instructed the Administration to devise a regular plan to convey to students the amount of Cooperative Program support which undergirds their education at Southeastern.
- 13. Requested the Committee on Instruction to investigate ways by which the Seminary might assist Faculty and Administrative Officers with their children's college education.
- 14. Approved the Edward A. McDowell, Jr., Greek Award.
