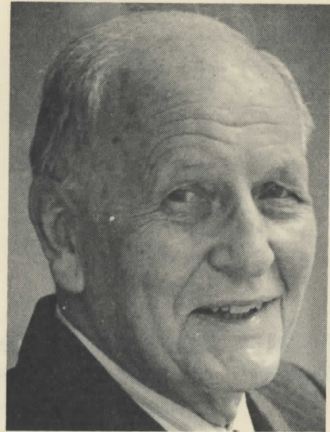

Theodore F. Adams

Baptist preacher, pastor, author, teacher, statesman, Theodore F. Adams came to Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary in 1968 for a "one-year teaching appointment" He stayed ten, and with his wife Esther, brought an unparalleled warmth to this campus. He had retired in 1968 as pastor of Richmond's First Baptist Church where he had served since 1936. He retired again in 1978 and served Southeastern as a Development Counselor until his death in 1980.

Ted Adams served his Lord with distinction and humility. To numerous colleges, universities, hospitals, and denominational agencies, he contributed rare insight and patience. God called him beyond the confines of his church and denomination to serve the needs of people around the world. His heart was open to persons of all races and nationalities, and from 1955 to 1960 he served as President of the Baptist World Alliance.

From his preaching, writing, lectures and conversations with persons of all persuasions have come women and men of higher vision and deeper dedication. Through these lectures and in countless other ways, his life continues to make an impact on all who knew and loved him.



Thomas H. Conley

The Senior Minister of Northside Drive Baptist Church in Atlanta, Georgia, was born in Jacksonville, Florida, but spent his childhood and youth years in Columbia, South Carolina.

Conley received the B.A. degree from Furman University in 1959, the B.D. degree in 1962 and the Th.M. degree in 1964 from Southern Seminary. The latter degree was earned in the field of Psychology of Religion.

In 1974, he became Senior Minister of the University Baptist Church, Hyattsville, Maryland, and in June, 1976 assumed his present ministry.

Mr. Conley has written for religious education materials and is the author of four books: **Two In the Pulpit**, **Sermons In Dialogue**; **Pastoral Care for Personal Growth**; **Experimental Preaching Styles**; and **Worship at Northside Drive**.

He has delivered lectures on a variety of subjects, including worship, pastoral care, religious liberty, and preaching. In 1981, he delivered the Winter Lectures on Preaching and Worship for the Georgia Baptist Hospital Clinical Pastoral Education.

His hobbies include water skiing, racquet ball, golf, song and hymn writing, and poetry. He is married to the former Betty Bishop of Summerville, South Carolina, and they are the parents of two sons, Scott, 16, and Sean, 12.
