1. M4240 Afro-American Christianity. 2 hours. 3-5 on Wednesdays.	
Dr. Boddie will give special attention to the study of the Black Preacher/Pastor dealing with his function and lifestyle. He will deal with the "motivation and response" of the black pastor as he has sought to meet his needs and those of his constituents in their struggle for self realization He will attempt to describe and evaluate the climate and conditions which give rise to the distressing aberration, "conflict management" within the Black Church.

2. T3053 Black Theology. 2 hours. 5-7 on Thursdays.

In addition to the customary subject matter of this course, Dr. Boddie will deal with the centrality of the Negro Spiritual and other songtypes. He speaks of "an aetiological treatment of an eschatological phenomenon". He will evaluate the song in the American black cultural experience with emphasis upon an inquiry into its origin. He will attempt to establish the viability, authenticity, and prestige of these popular but amorphous Afro-American song-types. Dr. Boddie will utilize group dynamics in that the class will participate in singing these spirituals in order to appreciate their therapeutic and aesthetic value.
