## OVERHEAD PROJECTORS IN CLASSROOMS

There are presently four classrooms equipped with overhead projectors and screens; they are J102, J202, A109, and A205. Each of the projectors is equipped with a roll of acetate which you may write on much as you would a chalkboard. When doing so, please use only the non-permanent pens provided in the Stealey Hall supply room. Regular felt-tip pens will not wash off.

Sheets of acetate are available in the AV office for use in class instead of the acetate roll and for advance preparation of transparencies, either your own creation or copied material. We will be happy to assist in preparing transparencies.

Those of you who use the projectors can help us in one important way. If you notice the roll of clean acetate is nearly empty, please notify the AV office so that we can change it before it runs out. -Ed Sansbury

INDEX TO SBC SEMINARY THESES
The SBC Historical Commission has just sent us the Index of Graduate Theses in Baptist Theological Seminaries, 1976-1979. This sixth volume in the series completes the coverage from 1894 through 1979. Volume 1 in 1969 covered the period 18941962. It is interesting to note that neither Golden Gate nor Midwestern had theses completed from 1976-1979.
