ADDITIONAL SEMINARY COUNSELING SERVICES: Dr. Randall Lolley, President of the Seminary, Dr. Ted Adams, Director of Counseling, Dr. James Moseley, Seminary Physician, and Dr. Andrew Lester,

Director of the School of Pastoral Care at North Carolina Baptist Hospital announce the expansion of counseling services available to the seminary

family.

The School of Pastoral Care has opened a satellite center in Raleigh which will provide to this area of North Carolina the same professional

services and ministries available through the school in Winston-Salem, and the other satellite in Fayetteville. This will include pastoral counseling (individual, marital, family), training programs for clergymen, enrichment programs for lay persons, and consultation services for pastors and

other professionals.

The seminary is contracting with the School of Pastoral Care to offer further counseling services to the seminary family through this center as needed. This service is in addition to the regular program of counseling now conducted at the Health Center. The seminary will help underwrite the cost of these added services to the seminary family. The added service will be offered for a modest fee on the basis of the sliding scale used by the School of Pastoral Care. used by the School of Pastoral Care.

Dr. Ted Dougherty is the interim director of the satellite center in Raleigh and will be working at the office of the Life Enrichment Counseling Center, third floor, Cotton Building, Crabtree Valley Mall each Friday. He will be available only to the seminary family on Thursday evenings at

the Health Center on campus.

Dr. Ted Adams is serving as the liason person between the center in Raleigh and the seminary. Dr. Adams will be responsible for the funds used by the seminary for this purpose and will handle referrals. For further information on this added counseling service to the seminary family, please contact either Dr. Ted Adams, Dr. James Mosely, or Dr. Ted Dougherty.
