LIFE CONTEXT JOURNAL WORKSHOP: The Life Enrichment Center is sponsoring a Life Context Intensive Journal Workshop on Friday, April 28 from 6:00-10:00 p.m. and on Saturday, April 29 from 9:00 a.m.-9:00 p.m. The workshop will be held at the Center in the Wake Building-Suite 226, 3203 Woman's Club Dr. in Raleigh. Using methods developed by Dr. Ira Progoff, the workshop is designed to clarify where you are now in your life; determine what your resources are, and decide on new directions. Beyond self-analysis, it generates an inner energy with which next steps can be taken. The leader will be Dr. LaRee D. Naviaux, a developmental psychologist from Charleston, West Virginia.
