CLINICAL PASTORAL EDUCATION (EXTENDED UNIT): The Life Enrichment Center, a satellite center of the School of Pastoral Care of the N.C. Baptist Hospital, has announced plans for an extended unit of Basic Clinical Pastoral Education to begin on October 11, 1976 and extend through May 9, 1977. The program involves a full day on Mondays of seminars and supervision and at least 8 hours involvement per week in a parish ministry. Students who register through the Registrar's Office may receive credit for M390 and M 391 for a total of 8 semester hours. Interested students may contact supervisor, Dr. Dwight W. Cumbee, who is on the seminary campus on Tuesdays or by telephone at his office in Raleigh (781-2576).
