Dear Mrs. Williamson:

The Foreign Mission Board in session on last Thursday voted to ask our attorney to give earnest consideration to the matter of granting a pension for you and Brother Norman. The Board was of the opinion that Brother Norman was clearly entitled to the pension. They were in doubt, however, as to the question of your pension owing to the fact that you are not sixty-five years of age and not a total disability physically. I was instructed in the meantime to send you fifty dollars more making one hundred as a special gift of the Board until our attorney and Administrative Committee could come to some permanent decision with reference to the pension for you and Brother Williamson.

In the meantime I want you to know that personally I sympathize with you both greatly and will do everything I can to secure the pension for you.

As you doubtless know, we have entered a legal and binding contract with the Relief and Annuity Board of Dallas, Texas, with reference to this whole question of pensions. Therefore, the matter will have to be decided upon the implications of the contract we have entered into with the Relief and Annuity Board.

I will write you again as soon as the committee has made its report.
