There are 857 persons enrolled during the Fall semester, 1974.

Calculated on a full-time enrollment equivalent

(1 person for each 12 hours of course work),

ENROLLMENT the Fall enrollment is 695. This compares to

634 last year; 581 in 1972; 552 in 1971; and 520 in 1970.

Two classes in Old Testament Survey are being offered at night this semester. This initial experiment in night classes for credit has pleasantly surprised everyone. There are 194 perNIGHT sons enrolled in the two courses. They represent
CLASSES 89 churches in the area. For the most part the enrollees are teachers and workers in their churches.

A considerable number are students' wives.

The Faculty have selected four persons from their ranks to join the President in the initial phase of a process to select a Dean of the Faculty. Those selected are Professors SELECTION Copeland, Durham, Eddins, and Harris. These four come from each of the areas of instruction and represent well the chronological spectrum of the Faculty. Their task will also include a study of the orderly growth and development of the Faculty.

President Lolley has recently officially announced two vacancies in the Faculty. The vacancies are in Church History and Pastoral Care. The established procedure for enlisting additional faculty will be followed carefully in filling these two vacancies. The Faculty have been asked to submit in writing any persons they desire for consideration.

The first Student Forum was held Friday, September 13 in the Cafeteria. Scores of students, faculty, and administrative personnel attended. The purpose of the Forum (to share STUDENT matters of mutual, public concern) was effectively FORUM realized. This practice, along with an occasional President's SHAR-A-THON, will provide regular opportunity for communication and airing of concerns. The next Forum is scheduled for October 25, at 10:00 a.m.

Steps are well under way for Southeastern to receive accreditation from the Southern Association of Schools and Colleges.

This regional agency, along with the national SOUTHERN
ASSOCIATION provide our school with a thorough and balanced accreditation. A Staff Visitor representing the Southern Association is

scheduled to visit our campus October 18, 1974.

The Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees, along with the Finance Committee and the Building and Grounds Committee, met on the campus, September 20, 1974. Several significant actions were taken: (1) Adoption of the plan to renovate the Library so as to realize the basic Library Design at an <u>estimated current cost</u> of approximately \$850,000 (subject to approval of full Board by mail

ballot); (2) Decision to proceed with construction of 6 three-bedroom units (12 apartments) of student housing, at a <u>current estimated cost</u> of

approximately \$222,000 (subject to approval of full Board by mail ballot); (3) Plans to proceed, through the Building and Grounds Committee, with the necessary work on the President's residence (details to be decided and reported later); (4) Decision as to allocation of 1973-74 SBC Cooperative Program Advance Funds if they are in fact received (the amount of these funds will not be determined until the close of the Southern Baptist Convention fiscal year, September 30, 1974).

The SBC Executive Committee met in Nashville, September 16-18, 1974. Dr. Carl Hudson, Chairman of Trustees, accompanied President Lolley to this first meeting for both men as Chairman and as President. Several key decisions affecting Southeastern were made by the

Executive Committee: (1) Cooperative Program
