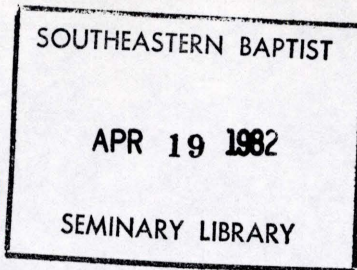

RAPE/ASSAULT PREVENTION:

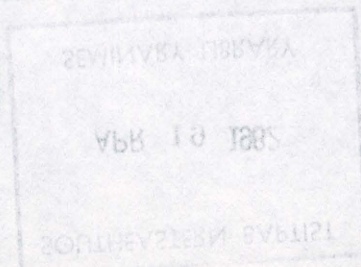
