Report on State of Churches read and adopted. REPORT

Last year 19 churches reported a total membership of 1,982; this year 20 churches reported a total membership of 2,258.

Last year 19 churches paid pastors \$2,525.18, an average of \$138.34 per church; this year 20 churches paid pastors \$2,715.56, an average of \$137.57 per church.

Last year 19 churches reported total financial expense, including pastors' salaries, \$2,716.19. This year 20 churches reported total expenses, including pastors' salaries, \$4,976.30.

Last year 7 churches reported \$242.01 for Co-operative Program. This year 5 churches reported \$118.71 for Co-operative Program.

Last year 11 churches paid Orphanage \$149.67. This year 10 churches paid Orphanage \$176.37.

Last year 18 churches reported Sunday schools with a total enrollment of 1,578. This year 20 churches reported Sunday schools with total enrollment of 1,826.

Last year three churches reported W. M. U's. This year two churches reported W. M. U's.

Last year 3 churches reported B. Y. P. U's. This year 4 churches reported B.Y.P.U's.

This year 4 churches reported Sunbeams. Last year 14 churches reported 96 Baptisms. This year 16 churches reported 127 Baptisms.

We find that we have gained in membership, church expenses, Orphanage, Sunday school enrollment, B.Y.P.U's. and additions by baptism. We also find a decrease in pastors' salaries.

We, your committee, earnestly beg that we awake to our duty and press forward and not backward.

There are about 600 children at Thomasville and about 300 in homes with mothers, that are helped from the fund that is contributed by the Sunday S. and churches. We recommend that each S.
