

The Speakers



Archie L. Nations is Professor of New Testament Interpretation at Southeastern Seminary. A native of Bastrop, Louisiana, he holds degrees from Baylor University, Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, and Vanderbilt University.

Dr. Nations has served as pastor of churches in Alabama and Tennessee, and served from 1961 to 1966 as a missionary in Japan under appointment of the Foreign Mission Board. He has taught at Southeastern since 1966 and is married to Dr. Peggy Starkey, Assistant Professor of Religion at Meredith College. He has four sons, Scott, Chris, Eric, and Jeffrey.



Delos Miles became Associate Professor of Evangelism at Southeastern on August 1, 1981, coming from a similar post at Midwestern Baptist Theological Seminary. He was formerly a pastor in Virginia and secretary of the Department of Evangelism and Associational Missions, Virginia Baptist General Board. From 1966 to 1978, he directed the evangelism ministries of the General Board of the South Carolina Baptist Convention.

Dr. Miles is a graduate of Furman University, Southeastern Seminary and San Francisco Theological Seminary. He and Mrs. Miles, the former Nada Laverne Lemons, have four children, Angela Denise, Daniel DeLos, John Stuart, and Miriam Renee.



Christine Gregory is First Vice President of the Southern Baptist Convention. A member of the First Baptist Church of Danville, Virginia, Mrs. Gregory recently completed a six-year term as President of the Southern Baptist Woman's Missionary Union. She is also member of Southeastern Seminary's Development Council.

She is a graduate of Winthrop College and has served as Minister of Education in Greer, S.C. and Danville, Va. She and Mr. Gregory are the parents of three sons, Harry, Gene and Joel.
