My call to the ministry came late in life at a point when I was established in a job, my family and a home. As a family person, I have experienced some of the problems and frustrations many of you have. During these periods of increased stress I have been ministered to by students, faculty and administration. From these experiences I decided to seek the office of Student Council President. I wish to be of service and minister to others as it has been done to me.

If I get the opportunity to serve, there are several areas of concern I hope to work on. Following in the footsteps of previous administrations, I want to keep the idea of December graduation before the decisionmakers. The acquisition of a Seminary Chaplain is another concern. We need closer ties between students, faculty and administration as we maximize use of available resources and seek new ones. Students need to be more involved in designing new course offerings. We need to know far in advance what courses will be offered in each semester to plan our educational goals. Library hours may need to be adjusted to meet student needs. Student peer groups can be of great help in ministering to new students. Chapel services need to show more balance in line with student needs. Educational programs are needed but most of us need devotional types of services with more student preaching. We need to continue to develop our off-campus ministry to the community, especially in the areas of tutoring and care of the elderly. These elections are important because this is your student government. Please exercise your option and vote for the candidates of your choice.

In our denomination we have recently become preoccupied with our diversity. We have not celebrated our common mission. I believe that we can overcome our differences by focusing on Christ and truly being his body. I am dedicated to developing koinonia on our campus. The Student Council is a means of nurturing that kind of growth.

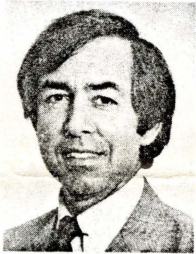

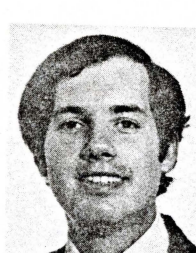
