ASSERTIVENESS TRAINING OPPORTUNITY: 1. Do you ignore it when someone pushes in front of you in line? 2. Do you find it difficult to ask a friend to do a favor for you? 3. Are you reluctant to express your negative feelings to others when it is appropriate? 4. Do you find it difficult to refuse the requests of others? 5. If a professor treats you in a way you feel is unfair, do you keep those feelings from him? 7. Do you have difficulty exchanging a purchase with which you are dissatisfied? 8. Are you reluctant to speak up in a discussion or a debate? If you answer "yes" to many of the above questions, you may benefit from an assertiveness training experience. An assertiveness training course will be offered by the Life Enrichment Center beginning Monday, October 4, at 7:00 p.m. in the Commons Room of Mackie Hall. The training periods will be 7:00-8:30 p.m. for 10 Monday evenings. The training leader will be Mr. Lyman Ferrell, a counselor with the Life Enrichment Center. Enrollment for this training will be limited to 20 persons. Cost for each participant will be \$20.00 plus \$2.50 for textbook.
