To receive a <u>full</u> Keesee Scholarship, you must comply with the following regulations set forth by the **KEESEE RECIPIENTS...** trustees of the Charles B. Keesee Educational Fund: (1) M.Div., MRE, and MACE students must take 10 hours. (2) A.Div. students must take 12 hours. (3) A student must be taking classes on the Wake Forest seminary campus in order to be eligible for a grant from Keesee. Hours taken at Shelby <u>do not qualify</u> as part of the necessary hours you must take in order to receive Keesee. Students enrolled in CPE or the Intern Year Away program <u>do not qualify</u> for any funds from Keesee. (4) Classes must be taken during the full fall or spring semester. Hours taken during Interterm classes and "spring break" or "fall break" classes <u>do not qualify</u> as part of the necessary hours you must take in order to receive Keesee. for this semester is near.
