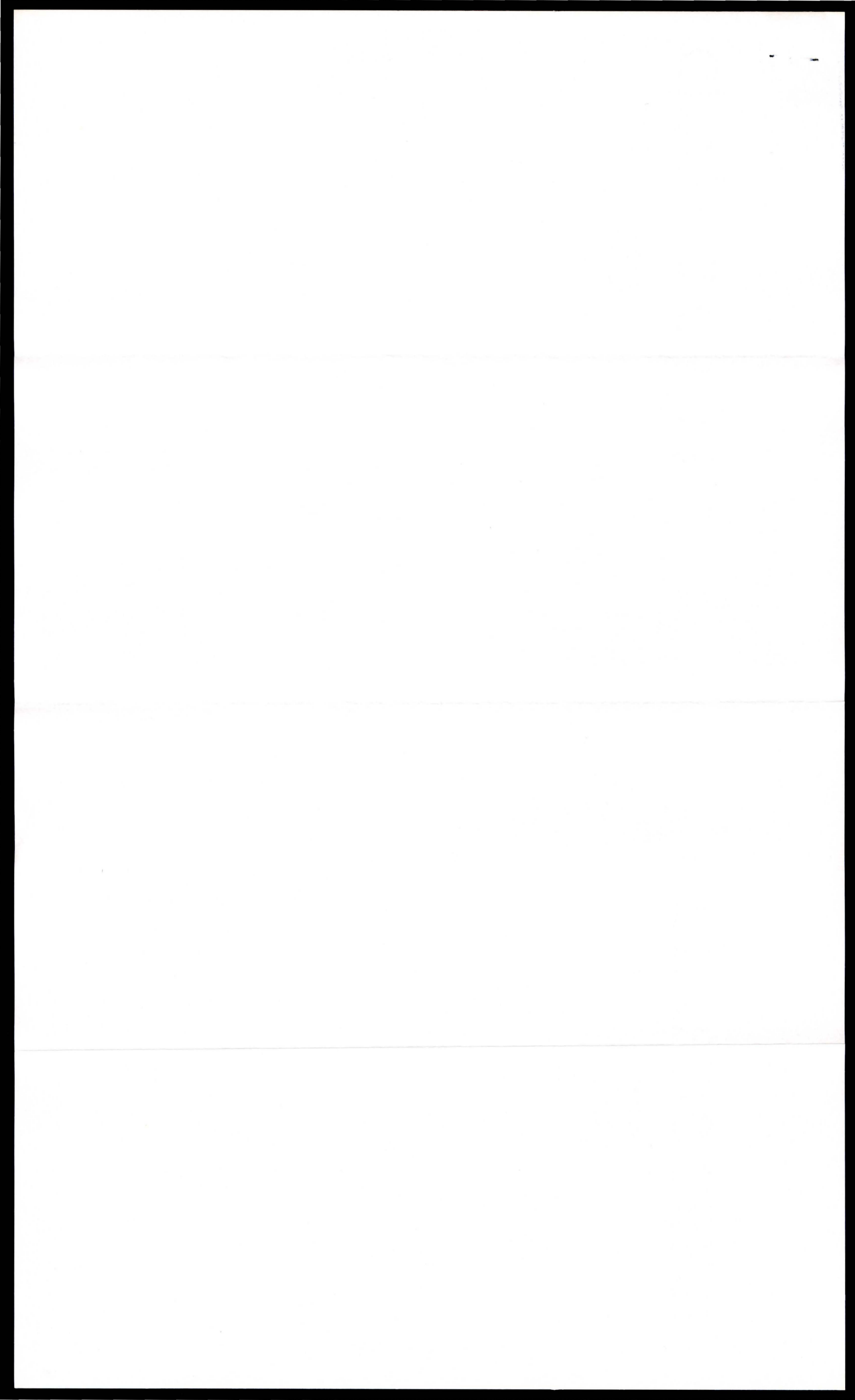

The trustees met on campus March 9-10. Among their actions were the following:

1. Ratified mail ballots electing Dr. Morris Ashcraft, Dean, and Dr. Delos Miles, Associate Professor of Evangelism.
2. Committed themselves to long-range planning participation based on the self-study data during 1982.
3. Conferred tenure on Dr. Robert D. Dale, Professor of Pastoral Leadership and Church Ministries.
4. Approved sabbatical leaves (1981-82) for Dr. Max G. Rogers and Dr. Richard A. Spencer.
5. Approved a resolution of appreciation for Dean Albert L. Meiburg for his six-years service as Dean.
6. Approved an additional 1% in matching funds on base salary for seminary employees participating in the annuity program.
7. Approved a 1981-82 budget amounting to \$4,029,234.
8. Accepted the consultant's report on Administrative Officers: Job Classification/Salary Scale.
9. Approved surveying of certain property owned by the seminary.
10. Priced the 26 lots in Heritage Woods.
11. Endorsed the concepts of a seminary foundation and a pooled income fund.
12. Approved several designated endowment funds:
 - The Ellis W. Hollon Award in Philosophy of Religion
 - The Queen Endowed Student Internship Fund
 - The Eileen Lackey Sharpe Scholarship Fund
 - The J. Lake Williams Award in Christian Ethics
13. Approved the concept of a part-time chaplain/minister while continuing counseling services provided by the Life Enrichment Center.
14. Recognized rotating trustees Frank Campbell (NC), Jerry DeBell (OH), Tom Brandon (TX), and Robert Ramsay (MS) for their service on the Board.

members heard reports indicating that the amount raised on gifts and pledges for the \$3½ million "Equipping for Bold Mission" campaign is right at \$3 million

with eight months to go before permission for the special campaign expires. Plans were laid which should assure completion of the effort on schedule by the end of 1981.
