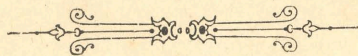

MINUTES

Of the Forty-Seventh Annual Session of the HARMONY PRIMITIVE BAPTIST ASSOCIATION, held with Mars Hill Church, Calhoun county, Ga., Commencing on Saturday before the 2d Sunday in October, 1885.

- 1st. The Introductory Sermon was preached by Elder E. D. Ivey, from the 10th chapter and 5th verse of Paul's Epistle to the Hebrews: "Wherefore, when he cometh into the world, he saith, sacrifice and offering thou wouldst not, but a body hast thou prepared me."
- 2d. After an intermission of one hour, the Messengers from the several churches assembled, and the Association was organized. Prayer by Elder J. R. Respass.
- 3d. Letters from the Churches received, read and minuted.
- 4th. Elected Elder J. M. Woodall Moderator, and electe R. F. Ivey Clerk.
- 5th. Called for Petitionary Letters.
- 6th. Invited Ministers of our faith and order to seats.
- 7th. Appointed the following Committees:

To Examine Correspondence—Elder T. Everett, E. Fain, W. T. Lott.
- 9th. Called for Correspondence from Sister Associations. Received from the Upatoie, Messengers Eld. J. Respass, Elder B. Stewart, J. W. English, with minutes.
From the Union—Elder A. Parish, with minutes.
From the Chocktawhatchee—Eld. D. H. Pellum, Elder J. W. Parker, Eld. E. D. Ivey, W. J. Parish and W. J. Hutto.
From the Echaconnee—Eld. J. Bassett.
From the Flint River—Elder. J. V. Tipton, Elder S. E. Davis, Eld. J. Maxwell, E. B. Bush and S. Williams.

12th. Called for the Report of the Committee on Business. They recommended as our guidance last year's minutes. The same were heard and adopted.

13th. Called the roll and read the Decorum.

14th. Called for further Correspondence.

15th. Called for the Report on Correspondence, and there was nothing found claiming attention.

16th. Appointed Union Meetings:

1st District, at Mt. Olive, commencing Friday before the first Sunday in July, 1886.

2d District, at Harmony, Sumter county, commencing Friday, before the 5th Sunday in August, 1886.

3d District, at Mars Hill, commencing Friday, before the 5th Sunday in May, 1886.

17th. Returned Correspondence to the Upatoie, to convene with Bluff Springs Church, Macon county, commencing Tuesday after the first Sunday in September '86—Messengers, Eld. J. Everett, J. W. Gwynes, E. Fain, J. W. Castleberry, H. H. Bell, Elder W. T. Everett.

Echaconnee Association—To convene with Bethlehem Church, Upson county, Ga.—Messengers, G. W. Gwynes.

Union Association—To convene with Empire Church, Berrien county, Ga., to convene Saturday, before the third Sunday in October, 1885.

Chocktawhatchee Association—To convene with Hopeful Church, Dale county, Ala., 5 miles west from Ozark, commencing Friday, before the fourth Sunday in September, 1886—Messengers, E. Fain, B. F. Markett and Eld. W. T. Everett.

21st. Appointed the next Session of this Body to convene with the Church at Antioch, Stewart county, Ga., commencing on Saturday before the 2d Sunday in October, 1886.

22d. On motion, a vote of thanks is hereby tendered to the people in the surrounding neighborhood of Mars Hill Church, for their kind hospitalities extended to our Association. May the Lord bless you, as seemeth good to Him, is our prayer.

23d. Read the Minutes and adjourned.

PRIMITIVE BAPTISTS' ARTICLES OF FAITH.

1st. We believe in one only true and living God, and that there are three persons in the God-head, viz.: The Father, Son and Holy Ghost.

2d. We believe the Scriptures of the Old and New Testament are the word of God, and the only rule of faith and practice.

3rd. We believe in the doctrine of eternal and particular election.

4th. We believe in the doctrine of original sin.

5th. We believe in the doctrine of man's impotency to recover himself from the fallen state, he is in by nature, of his own free will and ability.

6th We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God, only by the imputed righteousness of Christ.

7th. We believe that God's elect shall be called, converted and sanctified by the Holy Spirit.

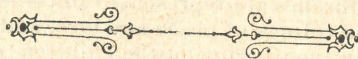
8th. We believe that the saints shall persevere in grace, and shall never finally fall.

9th. We believe that Baptism, the Lord's Supper, and washing of the Saint's feet, are ordinances of Christ, and that true believers are the only subjects of these ordinances, and that the true mode of baptism is by immersion.

10th. We believe in the resurrection of the dead, and a general judgment.

11th. We believe that the punishment of the wicked will be everlasting, and that the joys of the righteous will be eternal.

12th. We believe that no minister has a right to the administration of the ordinances of Baptism and the Lord's Supper, only such as are regularly called, and come under the imposition of hands by a regularly authorized Presbytery.
